Cicely is survived by her ex-husband Brian Ward Ridley; four children Katharine Anne, Elizabeth Sarah, Charles Aidan and James Edward; and six grandchildren Anna and Garret children of Katharine, Chris and Sam children of Aidan, and Harrison and Flynn children of James.
