Well, I don't know what happened. You could go to a new directory and see if you can checkout a new working copy. If you can, then you could copy your modified files from the broken copy, but be careful because there could be conflicts between your broken copy and the newly checked-out version. It would help to know what revision you are using in the broken directory.

I'm going to forward this conversation to CISL, attn Gary Studwell, and see if Gary has any suggestions. I'll copy you. I assume you are using the proxy url.
