Short Description :: CSAC is an HAO/NCAR Strategic Initiative that has its roots in HAO's long-standing expertise in the development of spectro-polarimeters and the interpretation of polarized radiation for remote sensing of magnetic fields in the Sun's atmosphere. CSAC provides a centralized access portal for all the Stokes polarization data produced by instruments with HAO participation. It also offers a comprehensive collection of manuals and tools for the manipulation, calibration, and analysis of spectro-polarimetric data, including data reduction and calibration, spectral line inversion, magnetic field disambiguation, and data visualization codes. We are currently working hard on upgrading the website (which is our main interface with the community) and developing data calibration and spectral line inversion software in order to accommodate the new data streams of instruments that are scheduled to come online in the near future (such as ChroMag and VISP).
